#### A NOTE FROM PASTOR JENNIFER ROSE

ear Friends, Aaah, January. A new month. A new year. Time to start fresh and turn the page on 2015, looking forward to what this new year has in store. Sometimes it seems to me that January is a bit of "The Season of Regrets". We look over the past year and realize all the people we've forgotten to contact, step on the scale and regret everything we've eaten from Thanksgiving through New Years', look at credit card bills and cringe, and (maybe) regret some gifts we received and go return them. And worse yet, all the feelings of Christmas time seem to wear off. So we make lists of resolutions, and come up with things we want to change. They say a lot about who we are and who we want to be. They give great insight into our desires and the hopes we have for ourselves. Some hope to be thinner and healthier. some resolve to have a

more positive outlook on life, some desire to be better friends and stay in touch with family more, some want to be more responsible with their money, and some hope to be more faithful in prayer and reading the Bible.

(2:20) We are no longer left on our own to make resolutions and "fix" our lives -God has already done that for us! Each day is a new beginning in Him, with all the hope and expectation that we have on January 1st. If things need to change, trust God to put those desires in your heart and when He does, be sure to follow. And may God draw near to you and guide you in 2016.


#### The Lord's Prayer Challenge!
