### Believing in the future takes faith.

At this time of the year we are given an opportunity to recommit to our walk with the Lord. A relationship with God is a two-way street. He is there to help us, but he expects us to follow His plan. In the reading below from the book of Genesis, God called Abram to leave his country and his people and go to a land that God would show him. God promised to guide him, but Abram had to step out in faith.. God has promised to be with us as we seek direction in every aspect of our lives, but he may also ask something of us. As with Abram, God may be calling us away from a familiar way of living which may be dragging us down. And if we want to make progress, we will need to follow His plan.

Genesis 12:1 The Lord had said to Abram, "Leave your native country, your relatives, and your father's family, and go to the land that I will show you. 2 I will make you into a great nation. I will bless you and make you famous, and you will be a blessing to others. 3 I will bless those who bless you and curse those who treat you with contempt. All the families on earth will be blessed through you."

One of the distinctions between us and the rest of created life is that while the critters of the earth such as animals and the like, are content with surviving, humans are not content to simply survive; we are driven to thrive. So how is it that we can thrive as God's people in this new year walking with the Lord?

For instance: We can ask God to help us recommit to deeper intimacy with Him through action and contemplation. We can ask God to give us a willingness to read His Word each day...even a sentence or two as a means to connect with Him. And we can listen for God's direction within the silence of our days. If we are not naturally inclined to be silent; we can

practice being silent, even for a brief few moments to hear what and how God is calling us into a deeper relationship with Him.

I invite you to explore what it means to be a thriving child of God in 2020 and share with me your findings. I enjoy hearing how God is transforming lives and hearts; a person at a time.

Following the offering of our gifts, we approach the second high point of our liturgy, the Sacrament of Holy Communion. We pray for and assure each other of the Lord's presence. Then comes the invitation to "lift up our hearts" and "give thanks to the Lord, our God". This reminds us that the entire communion service is a service of thanksgiving. We join our voices with the angels who gather round the Lord's throne and sing "Holy, Holy, Holy" and we welcome Him with the Palm Sunday multitude singing "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"

We then pray the Lord's prayer, which Jesus himself taught us. We are reminded that at the communion table, we are not many individuals but one body, brothers and sisters in faith, whose spiritual welfare is closely linked together.

In the words of institution, which Jesus spoke to us on the night He was betrayed, we make the Lord's Supper a celebration, not just a custom, but a sacrament instituted by Christ Himself. He assures us that he is present to give us forgiveness and fellowship with Him. With these words, the pastor consecrates the bread and wine, setting them apart for holy use. As Jesus gave Himself for us on the cross, He gives Himself to us in communion. In this way, He assures us personally that the blessings He won for all on the cross are most certainly for each of us individually. We sing hymns that focus our thoughts on the meaning and benefit of the Lord's Supper.
