First Lutheran is offering a Bible and Book Study beginning April 8th from 10:30-11:30 am for 9 weeks. The study is titled *Being Mortal* by Atul Gawande. The book was named the best book of the year by the *Washington Post*, *The New York Times* Book Review, *NPR*, and the *Chicago Tribune*. Here is a description of the book found on Amazon.

Medicine has triumphed in modern times, transforming the dangers of childbirth, injury, and disease from harrowing to manageable. But when it comes to the inescapable realities of aging and death, what medicine can do often runs counter to what it should.

Through eye-opening research and gripping stories of his own patients and family, Gawande reveals the suffering this dynamic has produced. Nursing homes, devoted above all to safety, battle with residents over the food they are allowed to eat and the choices they are allowed to make. Doctors, uncomfortable discussing patients' anxieties about death, fall back on false hopes and treatments that are actually shortening lives instead of improving them.

In his bestselling books, Atul Gawande, a practicing surgeon, has fearlessly revealed the struggles of his profession. Here he examines its ultimate limitations and failures—in his own practices as well as others'—as life draws to a close. Riveting, honest, and humane, "Being Mortal " shows how the ultimate goal is not a good death but a good life—all the way to the very end.

Vicar Lynn and I hope you can find time in your upcoming weeks to join us for this lifeenhancing conversation regarding what matters in the end. Also, we will hold a funeral planning workshop at First Lutheran on June 21st at 5:30 pm for anyone interested.





The Worship Corner by the Worship & Music Committee Hymn #4 on our Top Ten Hymn List is "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing", written by Robert Robinson in 1757. Robinson was an unruly child. His father died when he was just eight years old. He was gifted intellectually but made too much mischief for his loving mother, and she apprenticed him out at age fourteen. Instead of learning and working, he chose a life of gambling, drinking and

carousing. One night, he and his friends decided to attend an evangelist meeting just to heckle the preacher, George Whitfield. Instead, Robert felt that the words were meant only for him. When he was twenty, he gave his life to God and entered the ministry. He wrote this hymn at age twenty-two. Millions of Christians can relate to his spiritual story — "prone to wander, Lord I feel it" and the testimony — "O to grace how great a debtor daily I'm constrained to be"! 
Each Red Cross blood drive and donation center follows the highest standards of safety and infection control. To ensure the health of staff and donors, precautions include:

- Checking temperatures of staff and donors *before* entering a drive to make sure they are healthy. Scheduled appointments only—NO walk-ins.
- Providing hand sanitizer for use before the drive, as well as throughout the donation process.
- Following social distancing between donors including entry, donation and refreshment areas.
- <u>Ensuring face masks or</u> <u>coverings are worn by both</u> staff and donors.
- Routinely disinfecting surfaces, equipment and donortouched areas.
- Wearing gloves, and changing gloves often.
- Using sterile collection sets and an aseptic scrub for every donation.

After a one year absence, the ever-popular Minnesota State Community and Technical College's Empty Bowls is returning this year at a time when need for the fundraiser has never been greater. This won't be the traditional *Empty Bowls* – it won't be at the college, and guests truly will get an empty bowl. But one thing isn't changing: The fundraiser will continue to benefit the Fergus Falls Salvation Army, which has seen its food needs soar more than 1,000 percent since the pandemic began. This year's socially distanced Empty Bowls is set for 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and 4:30-6 p.m. Thursday, April 15, at A Center for the Arts in downtown Fergus Falls. Charest said AC4TA (A Center for the Arts) graciously invited the college to use their back stage doors, having guests enter through one back door, choose a bowl from a

display on the center's stage and exit through a second back door. Parking is conveniently located in the City Parking Lot directly behind A Center for the Arts. Pre-pandemic guests at *Empty Bowls* were served soup in the pottery bowls they'd selected in Legacy Hall on the M State campus. This year, for a suggested donation of \$20, guests will get the bowl of their choosing and a copy of the recipe for the *Empty Bowls* favorite, chicken wild rice soup. The organizers do not want you to leave hungry, though, and have arranged for a food truck in the City Parking Lot behind AC4TA from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. In its previous 14 years, Empty Bowls has raised just under \$60,000 for the Salvation Army food program, and this year the support is needed more than ever.
