## **BLESSING OF THE PASCAL CANDLE**

*Paschal means relating to Easter. During the Easter service, the paschal candle is lit and is carried up through the church, reminding the people of the light of Christ's resurrection overcoming the darkness of the tomb. Thus, the paschal candle is a symbol of Christ rising from the dead. We also light the paschal candle during baptisms and funerals. The candle is inscribed with a cross, an alpha and omega, and the current year. This reinforces the point that Christ is present among us now and throughout eternity.*



Dear Friends, today we celebrate the glorious resurrection of Jesus Christ, his triumphant victory over sin and death. May this candle shine in our midst to remind us of the paschal mystery in which we share and which is made present in our midst daily.

Let us pray. God our Father, source of all light, bless this candle and make it holy. Through its presence among us may the light of Christ, risen in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds. **Amen.**

*Peter crosses the immense religious and social boundary that separates Jews from Gentiles in order to proclaim the good news of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, so that God's forgiveness in Jesus' name would reach out to all people.*

**NICENE CREED**
