CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

FIRST READING: Acts 8:26-40

Led by the Spirit, Philip encounters an Ethiopian official who is returning to his African home after having been to Jerusalem to worship. Philip uses their encounter to proclaim the gospel to him.

Upon coming to faith in Jesus, he is baptized by Philip.

²⁶An angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is a wilderness road.) ²⁷So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it." ³⁰So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" ³¹He replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. ³²Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this: "Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth. ³³In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth." ³⁴The eunuch asked Philip, "About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" ³⁵Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?" ³⁸He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. ³⁹When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. ⁴⁰But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.



On the night of his arrest, Jesus taught his disciples about the relationship they would have with him. Those who abide in his word and love bear fruit, for apart from him, they can do nothing.






Hero Drive

First Lutheran Church will host an equipment and supply drive for the **Healthcare Equipment Recycling Organization (HERO)**, based in Fargo, during the entire month of May. This non-profit organization, started by a group of operating room nurses, accepts clean used healthcare equipment and new unopened healthcare supplies to distribute both locally and globally wherever the need is greatest.

Commonly accepted items include bedside commodes, canes, crutches, diabetic supplies, hearing aids and batteries, incontinence supplies, nebulizers, nutritional drinks, respiratory supplies, walkers, wheelchairs (manual or electric), and more. **Items NOT accepted include** soiled or broken equipment, expired products, exposed needles, fabric mattresses, mercury thermometers, open or partially used personal hygiene products, prescriptions of any kind, renal or peritoneal dialysis supplies, or items used with patients treated for C-Diff, MRSA, or VRE. Please see the complete list on the posters at the front counter in the narthex.

If you have items to donate, please drop them off in the church narthex behind the counter just left of the main entrance on Sunday before worship or during regular church office hours, Monday – Thursday between 8:00 AM and 4:30 PM. A self-serve station there provides a list of accepted items and donation receipts for you to record your donation.

Items will be accepted through Monday, May 31. If you have an item that takes two or more people to lift and move, please call or text **Steve Guttormson at 218-770-7274** to make special arrangements for drop off.
