#### In Reflection of the Pandemic:

Join us in-person or on YouTube on Sunday, May 23rd for worship where the secret message decoded by the 1st-6th graders will be revealed.




First Communion Class April 1, 2021

Welcome to Spring!

I always connect with God by being outside but in spring, I seem to spend so much more time outside. Spring is my reward for surviving winter. It is a promise that after you experience the harshness of life, new life follows. Spring gives me hope. So, it is no surprise that we celebrated Easter last month - in spring.

The church season of Easter is seven Sundays long. This year it runs April 4 to May 16<sup>th</sup>. So, as we continue in the Easter season, let us be reminded of the resurrection of Christ with every new leaf and blade of grass.

It will cover a funeral service and writing obituaries. A representative from a funeral home will be present to answer any questions you may have. Workshop is FREE.

#### **HERO DRIVE**

First Lutheran Church will host an equipment and supply drive for the **Healthcare Equipment Recycling**Organization (HERO), based in Fargo, during the entire month of May. This non-profit organization, started by a group of operating room nurses, accepts clean used healthcare equipment and new unopened healthcare supplies to distribute both locally and globally wherever the need is greatest.

**Commonly accepted items include** bedside commodes, canes, crutches, diabetic supplies, hearing aids and



batteries, incontinence supplies, nebulizers, nutritional drinks, respiratory supplies, walkers, wheelchairs (manual or electric), and more. **Items NOT accepted include** soiled or broken equipment, expired products, exposed needles, fabric mattresses, mercury thermometers, open or partially used personal hygiene products, prescriptions of any kind, renal or peritoneal dialysis supplies, or items used with patients treated for C-Diff, MRSA, or VRE. Please see the complete list on the posters at the front counter in the narthex.

If you have items to donate, please drop them off in the church narthex behind the counter just left of the main entrance on Sunday before worship or during regular church office hours, Monday – Thursday between 8:00 AM and 4:30 PM. A self-serve station there provides a list of accepted items and donation receipts for you to record your donation.

Items will be accepted through Monday, May 31. If you have an item that takes two or more people to lift and move, please call or text **Steve Guttormson at 218-770-7274** to make special arrangements for drop off.



We've all heard of St. Patrick, or at least celebrated his day. Few people, however, have heard of the blind Irish monk, Dallan Forgaill, the writer of "Be Thou My Vision", our #3 hymn on the Top Ten Hymn List. Forgaill was a monk who ministered in the wake of Patrick's evangelism and church planting. He wrote the song as he remembered St. Patrick's mission and the zeal he had for life. The poem was part of the Irish monastic tradition, used as a prayer and chanted in old Irish. It wasn't till 1905 that it was finally translated by Mary Byrne and in 1912 set to

verses. Today the words and "Godward" vision are loved by believers just as they were hundreds of years ago by Irish believers.
