Please mark your calendars and join us for the Thursday Morning Bible Study at 10:30 in the Kairos Room. Bibles will be provided. On Thursday, September 9th, we will begin a 6 part session on the topic of lectio divina and chanting the psalms.



Lectio divina is an ancient spiritual practice for listening to a scripture passage with the ear of the heart. It is not the same as bible study. In lectio divina we let go of more intellectual, studious, or effortful ways of reading the scripture and enter a state in which we are quiet and receptive to God's word. We let go of our own words, and let God speak to us. In this practice, the words of scripture become very alive and touch the heart in spontaneous ways that lead us more deeply into relationship with God.

The method to practice lectio divina begins with the choice of a Psalm or biblical passage. Read through the passage four times, leaving a few minutes of silence between each reading.

- Listen with the ear of the heart. Notice if any phrase, sentence or word stands out and gently begin to repeat it to yourself, allowing it to touch you deeply.
- Reflect while you read the passage a second time with deep receptivity. Notice what thoughts, feelings, and reflections arise within you. Let the words resound in your heart. What might God be asking of you through the scripture?
- Respond spontaneously as you listen. Notice any prayerful response that arises within you, for example a small prayer of gratitude or praise.
- Rest in God's presence beyond thoughts and reflections. Just be.

I was first introduced to these two sacred practices in the 80's when I first began my contemplative practices through visiting various Catholic monasteries for silent retreats. For me, spending quiet time with the scriptures, especially the psalms, has been a gateway to deep spiritual consciousness. It has provided great wisdom and strength, grounding me in God's Word as I have grown in faith.

It is my hope that you are interested in embarking on this sacred journey along my side, as we explore the practices in greater depth.



Welcome to the 2021-2022 school year! I am looking forward to connecting with your family again as we enter a new year of Sunday School and FLY K-6. The last year and a half has been full of questions, changes, and has affected all of our lives, but the one thing that hasn't changed is that we are all a child of God and he loves us. God calls us to him and he calls us to love each other. Our theme this year is Matthew 19:14—Jesus said, "Let the children come to me." As we move forward in reconnecting, we are also looking to connect with Jesus and to grow closer to him. We are also going to hold in-person Sunday School class from 10:45-11:15 a.m. as a large group during the month of September and it will be outside in the lower parking lot outside the Fellowship Hall doors (in Fellowship Hall if weather doesn't permit). FLYK-6 will be outside at Roosevelt Park from after school to 4:30 on Wednesdays to allow for movement, learning, and connection. Also, we encourage all our families to attend worship both in-person or online. We are working to make people of all ages feel welcomed and feel that worship service is a special time for all to connect and learn about God. While children are in Sunday School, parents can enjoy fellowship with one another and discuss topics they are curious about at Connect. It is an opportunity to connect in multiple ways!

We hope that we are able to assist you and your child(ren)'s faith journey with our in-person and online experiences and that we all can move closer to Jesus as he calls his children to him.






# Sign up for a new Book Study this year at First Lutheran Church: In the Middle of the Mess

Exciting news from your council and Pastor of the latest happenings at First Lutheran.

I am pleased to introduce you to our new church office manager, Katie Kaderbhai. She has extensive experience in managing church offices and church work in parishes around the state. A graduate of Concordia College with a degree in K-12 Art Education, followed by a masters degree from Luther Seminary in Children, Youth and Family Ministry, has provided a strong background for this work. Please welcome her warmly when you see her. She will be responsible for the day to day operation of the church office and coordination of the staff.

Laurie Whitehead has retired, but thankfully has agreed to continue to produce the Messenger for the time being. We thank her for years of sharing her expertise and friendliness and we wish her well in her retirement. Also, Calie Anderson has resigned to take on a new full time position and we thank her for her hard work and involvement in FLC.
