

Be thankful in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you who belong to Christ Jesus. — 1 Thessalonians 5:18

The seasons are changing and the time has come to reflect, recognize and to give thanks for the blessings within our lives. Blessings are always present, but we may not take the time to notice their presence in our daily lives. 




Thank you, Pastor Stan!

He says of his time here that "I've always appreciated working with the Pastors beginning with Pastor Saul and Pastor Jennifer, and the interims,







Contrary to what you may have assumed by viewing the movie; Raiders of the Lost Ark and its sequels, the Ark of the Covenant was never hidden away in a secret location, with only a diabolical inner circle knowing its' location. But what I appreciate most about her is her compassion and the way she reaches out to people who are vulnerable and need a friend. Her brother Evan and her have a close relationship, always have, and we are grateful that they do. Her husband, Adam has been a welcome addition to our family. He has fit in well with us and his kindness and compassion are evident to those who know him.

Well, that's us in a nutshell. We have our flaws, but I suppose its best to let you discover that for yourselves ... We are also grateful for YOU, the people of 1st Lutheran for inviting us into your church family and to help me use my "retirement" years productively.

May God carry you through the coming month when times are good and when times are hard. Our God is

a faithful God and even when we have difficulty making sense of what life throws our way, we are assured that God is with us at all times, loving us and making His wisdom and power available to us and through us. And for THAT, I am extremely grateful.
