

First Lutheran Church 1872 - 2022

Growing up in The Parsonage at First Lutheran church—Memories from Janet Preus

My family moved to Fergus Falls in February of 1947: Rev. Christian and Dorothy, and children Tony (Anthony), Jonathon and Madelyn. My sister Betty (Elizabeth) was born in March not long after we arrive. I was born two years later, and Margi (Margaret) came along a few years later.

We lived in the Parsonage next door to the church, so we always had people coming and going. There was always someone who joined us for dinner after church on Sundays. Dad would stand in the back of the church greeting people as they left, and he would pick someone to invite for dinner. When mom would come home after playing the organ at the church service they would already be there. It was often a surprise to us as to who would be joining us for dinner.

Having the church right next door could be handy for other reasons. I wanted to surprise my mother, I think it was, with a birthday cake, so my friend Jane and I made it in the church kitchen. That was fine, until we lifted up the mixer – while it was running – and fluffy, sticky white frosting went everywhere! Jane's mother helped us clean it up.

I had a rather ideal childhood. Everyone knew me by name, and it was as if we had this larger "family" right next door at the church. Our backyard included the courtyard of the Parish House (it is what is now known as the choir room wing), where we raised baby ducks and chicks in the spring. It was also a great place to present play performances and dances for whoever we could get to watch.

I thought it was fun to have the church right next door. We would go see the secretary and visit the custodian. He was always so nice to us. We really didn't get in much trouble at the church because if we misbehaved, we were embarrassing our parents, and everyone knew who our parents were.

Mom played the organ at church and would often practice in the evening. In nice weather, with the windows open, we could hear her playing, and I think it was comforting to know just where she was.

There was a committee that looked after the parsonage to make sure it was maintained properly. I remember when they decided the kitchen needed to be remodeled. The committee worked closely with mom to plan and execute with her preferences kept in mind.

As a pastor, I think Dad saw himself truly as a shepherd. He made a point of meeting people one on one and inviting them to church, and I'm sure he liked being that kind of pastor. He and mom also did a lot of entertaining, inviting new members over once a month, and including current members to they could get to know each other. I thought it was fun sitting on the steps in the hallway and listening to them visit.

When dad needed a break, he would sometimes wait for me to get home from school and take me to a nearby lake for fishing, or we'd head to Fossen Woods for picnic. His "preacher's holiday" was going to our lake cabin, a hunting trip to Wyoming, or fishing in Canada.

I liked being in choir, Sunday School, confirmation, and Luther League. It was just what everyone did. But when I got a horse in my teens and learned horse shows were usually on Sunday afternoons out of town, I had to get a special excuse to miss Luther League so I could take my horse to a show. That was a really big deal. Confirmation and graduation gatherings were always important. Mom always made sure we had "our day," and Dad was always present for the family party. A special occasion usually meant Mom would make me a new dress, and I still remember exactly what my confirmation dress looked like.

I remember all of this with great fondness. My parents never complained of all the people coming and going. I just thought everyone lived like this!
