Unfinished Business: Discovering God's Call in the Not Yet

Dear FLC Friends,

We are invited to focus on God's call to experience renewal throughout this Lenten season and the invitation matches our season of life at First Lutheran Church. We are between "no longer and not yet" in terms of calling a senior pastor. The same is true of our individual and communal ministry. During these "in between times," we are changed.

On <u>Sundays from 10:45-11:15 am</u>, <u>(Lent 2-Palm Sunday)</u>, we will have a devotional time to reflect on the Vocare or Call of the day in the Conference Room. Our focus will reflect ongoing spiritual practice designed for us to embrace various callings so we can more intentionally live life on purpose for the common good.

We are beginning to <u>gather nominations for the Call Committee</u>. If there is someone you feel would be a good candidate, please submit their nomination to the church office. Our Church Council Co-Presidents will then reach out to candidates for the next step of the interview process.

<u>Fill the Cup</u> throughout each week and bring it in on Sundays. We have matching funds set up for at least two Sundays. Our **FIRST MATCHING SUNDAY IS MARCH 5, and it is an UNLIMITED MATCH** for funds brought that Sunday. So, keep filling those cups to give a hand up to neighbors in need. Our goal is \$10,000 by or on Easter Sunday.

As we continue our Lenten Journey of renewal, I leave you with a prayer and questions to reflect upon.

Prayer: O God, guide us in the unfinished business of life when we are in-between the already and not yet. Focus our hearts on your call for our lives. In Jesus' name, Amen.

What life values are preset for you in this experience of renewal? How does this experience of renewal invite you to be open? What voices are calling to you through this experience of renewal? As you consider this experience of renewal, what holds your attention?

What regrets does this experience of renewal does this bring to mind for you?

Where and how in this experience of renewal do you need to lean into who you are called to be and what you are called to do? *

As we continue to worship and pray together, may we return to God without whole heart. May God renew in us a right spirit and lead us from death to life in the name of our Savior, Jesus.

FAITH MILESTONE: First Communion

A unique faith experience begins for 5th graders and those that are ready to move to this faith milestone and their parents this month. This class with the students, the parents, and the Pastor provides an opportunity to prepare for the Sacrament of Holy Communion. The classes begin with a pottery making day as they mold a chalice for their First Communion. It continues with instruction and bread making. These tactile lessons are meant to help kids reflect on the things they've felt and learned about communion. After the instruction, students will experience their First Communion at the worship service on Maundy Thursday, April 6th at 6:30pm.

Grandparents and God-parents are encouraged to attend the service as a wonderful family celebration. Following the occasion, have these special adults share what the sacrament means to them. When we find an opportunity, take the time to discuss and affirm each of the gifts given in Holy Communion; being together with Jesus, receiving forgiveness, celebrating, giving thanks, receiving strength to serve receiving Jesus, and growing in faith.

Generosity at its finest

Local church donates \$27,000 to area organizations

The board of directors for the First Lutheran church Foundation in Fergus Falls met in early December to decide where to direct their annual community giving.

The foundation was able to provide a total of \$27,000 across 10 organizations that provide services to those most in need this season and throughout the year.

"The board always looks forward to our December meeting where we get to make these selections," explained Tim Johnson, board president. "We don't seek external funding requests, so that allows us as a board to determine where best to focus our resourced for the year. This year, we decided to focus much of this year's support on organizations that provide food to those in need."

The organizations that received the funding were: A Place to Belong, Salvation Army, Someplace Safe, Fergus Falls Community Food Shelf, Otter Cove Children's Museum, Shop With a Hero, Meals b Wheels, Jail Inc., Young Life and United Way, including the Weekend Feeding Backpack program and the Imagination Library.

"I want to thank First Lutheran Foundation for their generous donation," emphasized Summer Hammond, the executive director of the United Way of Otter Tail and Wadena counties. "The Weekend Feeding Backpack program provides food bags to students throughout Otter Tail County. The food bags provide an extra boost for children over the weekend that might otherwise be going without." Hammond noted that the program serves approximately 500-800 children a year.

you'll be there during lunchtime).



From the Archives Committee

Carol Roehl's 1998 Tanzania Adventure

Carol joined Operation Bootstrap Director Dana Miller, and four Rift Valley Walkers- one from Bethlehem in Fergus Falls, two from Mpls. and one from Denver, for a 16 day trip to Tanzania. Carol wanted more people to become informed and involved in Operation Bootstrap Africa (OBA), which she had supported for 8 years along with many First Lutheran Church and community members. Operation bootstrap had been created by David Simonson, an African Missionary with connection to our First Lutheran Church. Carol had an inner desire to go to Tanzania, this led her to apply for the 1998 trip, and was selected to become a part of the group. She gave an informative talk to her First Lutheran congregation before she left, and after she returned Carol gave several presentation about her time in Tanzania hoping to raise interest and funds to support OBA. Carol continues to be eager to talk about her experiences.

Carol's 1998 itinerary:

Friday, July 24– departed from Mpls.

Saturday, July 25- arrived in Amsterdam, and then off to Arusha

<u>Sunday, July 26</u>– joined a Maasai Congregation for church in Arusha, drove to Tarangire National Park and stayed at the lodge in a thatch covered tent

<u>Monday, July 27</u>– went on a Game Safari Drive at Tarangire, then to the Ngorongoro Crater and camped in the extinct crater along with hundred species of wildlife

Tuesday, July 28- visited 2 OBA Primary Schools

Wednesday, July 29- visited another OBA Primary School



<u>Thursday, July 30</u>– now Carol and Deana separated from the 4 Rift Valley walkers. The walkers would spend the next 6 days hiking The Great Rift Valley Trek guided by Missionary David Simonson's two sons who had also provided all supplies for the approximately 50 mile adventure. (The 4 walkers had each raised \$15,000 to help build schools in Tanzania)

<u>Friday July 31—August 7</u>- Carol and Deana spend their days touring Primary Schools, the MaaSae Girls Secondary School, hospitals and churches, recording information and experiences to share with churches and organizations back home. They spent time with David and Eunice Simonson at their home in Arusha. When they visited schools, David would often be walking in and around the properties making sure everyone and everything was in order. Carol and Deana spent time with Dr. Mark Jacobson at the Selian Hospital in Arusha. (Before Mark died in 2022, he had spent 4 decades in Tanzania stiving to provide the people with medical care and build exceptional medical facilities.)

Saturday, August 8- all 6 travelers left Arusah at 9:20 pm

Sunday, August 9– arrived back at Mpls., MN at 12:55 pm

Be sure to stop by the Chapel and look at the Tanzania items in the glass display case and also view some in the Narthex, on the west wall in the glass cabinet.


