



The excitement is building! Plans continue to be updated each week; supplies are being put to good use; and life-giving work is underway. They caulked and painted all the windows in the education wing to extend their life and will soon be asking for help with fixing the "Jesus' window" in the narthex because the wood around it is rotten. # DINNER CHURCH RETURNS

New this year... ways to pray, art as worship, and remembering the small catechism.

The Worship Corner by the Worship & Music Committee

The window above the balcony in the sanctuary depicts the four writers of the Gospel. Matthew, shown as a winged man, emphasizes in his Gospel the human nature of Christ. Represented as a winged lion, Mark teaches us about Christ's kingly character. Luke, here a winged ox, tells of Christ's sacrificial death. Finally, the winged eagle is John, who wrote of Christ's divine spirit, which lifts the soul.

The aisle windows hold the shields of the apostles, most of whom were martyred for their faith. Beginning on the north side and following around the sanctuary to the south side, each is represented by a symbol traditionally associated with his life and ministry: John (chalice and snake), Philip

(staff topped by a patriarchal cross), Matthew (money bag), Jude/Thaddeus (long –handled lance), Peter (crossed keys over and upside-down cross), Andrew (Saltire cross), Matthias (axe) and Thomas (carpenter's square), Bartholomew (flaying knife) and James (pilgrim staff and seashells). The last two symbols, the sword on an open book and the torch, have been tentatively identified with Simon and James the Less. At the top of these windows are traditional Christian Symbols: a heart representing God's love, the lamp as light of the World, the anchor of hope and faith, scales of a just God, an hourglass, reminding us that our days on earth are measured, and the cross. Upper level windows represent the victorious life. We carry the cross not as a burden but as a part of the victory procession celebrating salvation. In this journey, Christ is our shield.

#### "Building" Update Youth and Family Edition







#### **FLC Book Study**




