Dear Friends,

This time of year reminds us of bonfires, brilliant falling leaves, bountiful crops harvested, and sharing the abundance. Neighbors share conversations and cocoa/coffee, peppers and pep fests, all because we are Rooted in Abundance. Sharing the abundance becomes like breathing. Beefy slicing tomatoes and oblong squash appear on our doorsteps as if it is as natural as morning dew or frost.

FLC lives being Rooted in Abundance. Our fall stewardship appeal (of the same name) reflects how this "rootedness" is second nature at our church. FLC shares abundance whenever possible. Our giving tradition at FLC has always focused on how we share all our gifts – not just our financial gifts. A church needs innovative ideas, creative people to lead, individuals who know how to solve complex problems, and volunteers to keep our ministries focused on our neighbors. We can talk about this in a three-fold way: wealth, work, and wisdom. If any one of these areas is missing from our community, we are diminished.

Each of us has a gift; some have many: for some it is cooking and baking, others might have beautiful singing voices, we praise those who have an administrative gift of balancing books or counting the collection, we admire those who offer hospitality, who serve at the altar, who help us find a seat as the service begins. Whatever your ministries are, we could not be who we are without you.

As we learn through this year's "Rooted in Abundance" theme, we experience the freedom to share our gifts. We offer our tithes and offerings that empower visitation of homebound and the sick, choir and handbells, celebrating milestones like our 2nd graders receiving their Bibles, and confirmands learning the catechism. Our life together points towards God's abundance meant to be shared, not stored up.

This month we share God's abundance by:

- * honoring the legacy our loved ones who have died have left us on All Saints Sunday, 11/5.
- * preparing turkeys, potatoes, bars and serving the Harvest Dinner on Nov. 9.
- * continually sharing our financial abundance to help our church finish 2023 strong.
- * celebrating Promise Sunday, Friendsgiving, and Family Fun Day at Otter Cove on 11/19.
- * worshipping on 11/22 at the joint Thanksgiving Eve service and singing in the pop-up choir directed by Harriet Wicklund.
- * joining Bethlehem by going to the Concordia Christmas concert together the first weekend in December. (Sign up outside the church office.)

Together, let us live out being Rooted in Abundance every day in the name of Christ. Your gifts make all the difference, and we are eternally grateful that we celebrate God's abundance daily.

New this year... ways to pray, art as worship, and remembering the small catechism.

WEDNESDAYS | 5:30 PM FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH



The beautiful windows in the chapel were given as a memorial when the education wing was built in 1954. The altar windows appropriately remind us "Let the Children Come to Me", as Jesus commanded. Jesus and children are the central theme of the three windows on the west wall. In the center window, Jesus holds a child in his left arm and a bird in his right, representing love for all creation, of which God is the king, symbolized by the crown above his head. Below sits a child, holding flowers to give to Jesus—a reminder that serving God is the highest work we can do. Fluttering near the child, a beautiful butterfly reminds us that God has given us creation to enjoy. In

the left window, a mother brings her daughter and baby to Jesus; below them a father brings his son. This "Parents and Children" window depicts parents teaching children to pray. Three young people bow to Jesus in the right window, affirming the dedication of young lives to Christ through confirmation. Below, a mother presents her infant for baptism.

The north windows represent the means by which we receive salvation, a gift from a living God, through word and sacrament. In the first window, water flows from a shell, symbolizing the ancient manner of baptizing. On the right a dove with rays of light flowing downward to the font and the crown of life symbolize the Holy Spirit's presence at baptism and remind us of Jesus' words: "No one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit". "Blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it", is the theme of the second window with the word represented by an open Bible and cross—set in an orb, as God's word is brought to the world—the sword of justice, a candle to show enlightenment, birds suggesting the spiritual being and the tablets of the Ten Commandments with three proclaiming trumpets. A fleur de lis, a stylized lily, has long been the flower of annunciation, showing obedience to God's word. In the third window, a sheaf of wheat, a cluster of grapes, a chalice and a wafer suggest the bread and wine, the body and blood of the Lord's Supper. Fishes and loaves remind us of the feeding of the five thousand. The traditional crusaders cross, a cluster of five crosses, represent the five wounds of the body of Christ. The overturned vessel shows manna falling from heaven, with Christian life, nourished by the sacrament—growing as a lovely rose.

What a JOY it has been to get to know more of the youth and families at FLC. These humans are amazing, leading very busy lives and adding our programs to those busy lives. November has more opportunities for FLC to come alongside them.




Prayers for our kids and families.


